COURSE SETUP

Longmeadow Country Club will be set up at about 6,756 yards and will play to a par of 35-35-70.

FORMAT

54 holes, stroke play (18-holes per day), 150 players, comprised of qualified players and players fully exempt. The 50 lowest scorers & ties or anyone within 7 strokes of the leader after 36-holes will advance to the third round.

ENTRIES

Entries are open to professionals as well as amateur golfers who have an active Handicap Index® not exceeding 2.4 (at the time of registration), or who have completed their handicap certification.

ABOUT LONGMEADOW COUNTRY CLUB

Longmeadow Country Club is a historic and challenging private club that was founded in 1922, making this year its centennial anniversary. Traversing subtle and, at times, dramatic terrain, the Donald Ross routing calls for the judicious use of both power and finesse. The course was completed in 1924 followed by the clubhouse in 1926 when Architecture magazine featured Longmeadow including the landscape architecture of Frederick Law Olmsted.

Longmeadow hosted its first Mass Open in 1946, which marked the first playing of the championship since 1942 (event not held 1943-1945 due to World War II). It was also just the second time it was held in Western Massachusetts, following CC of Springfield in 1922. Former tennis professional Ellsworth Vines won the 1946 championship with a 1-stroke victory in an 18-hole playoff against Jerry Gianferante, who was the Longmeadow CC pro at the time. Longmeadow also hosted the Mass Open in 1982 and in 2002, with victories by Dana Quigley and Geoffrey Sisk, respectively.

In its 100 years of existence the membership roster included golf dignitaries such as: Bobby Jones, Roberta Bolduc, Gary Burnett, Flynt Lincoln, and Clarence J. Bennett (past president of Mass Golf). Milton Reach was the course's founder, and his son Milton Reach, Jr., was runner-up in the 1941 Mass Amateur. Milton Reach III is the club's historian.

In addition to hosting the Mass Open, Longmeadow has also hosted the Mass Amateur (1941, 1957, 1972, 1992 and 2013) and the Mass Women's Amateur (1989). In 1995, the club hosted the U.S. Girls' Junior Amateur with Marcy Newton defeating Andrea Cordova, 4 and 3, in the final match. Longmeadow also hosted the 2005 U.S. Junior Amateur with Kevin Tway, who currently competes on the PGA Tour, taking home the title over Brad Johnson, 5 and 3.

QUALIFYING

Playing over 18 holes, qualifying was held at six locations between May 2 and May 26, with 87 qualifiers, plus alternates, joining the exempt field.

SCHEDULE OF PLAY

Eighteen holes of stroke play are scheduled each day from Wednesday, June 8 through Friday, June 10. If the championship is tied after three rounds, a sudden-death playoff will take place immediately following the conclusion of the third round.

WHAT THE WINNER RECEIVES

The Clarence G. Cochrane Memorial Trophy and a gold medal will be presented to the Champion, and The Commonwealth Cup will be presented to the Low Amateur Champion. A professional purse of \$75,000 will be distributed to the low fifty (50) finishers and ties, with \$15,000 going to the winner. Merchandise certificates will also be awarded and are only redeemable at the host site.

2021 CHAMPION

Rob Labritz, a New York professional, became the second player to win the Mass Open in his 50s as he made five birdies on his first nine holes in the final round to hold off five players by one stroke. Since then, Labritz has earned his card for the PGA Tour Champions (Senior Tour).

TITLE DEFENSE

Since 1984, three players have won consecutive titles (Dana Quigley, 1982-1984; Geoffrey Sisk, 2006-2007; and Jason Thresher, 2016-2018). Quigley won his first Mass Open at Longmeadow in 1982.

CHAMPIONSHIP HISTORY

This is the 112th Massachusetts Open Championship. Out of all Mass Golf events, the Mass Open is the only one that includes professional golfers and has a professional purse.

The first Massachusetts Open was played at Vesper Country Club in Tyngsborough in 1905 and was won by famed golf course architect Donald Ross. The Massachusetts Golf Association (MGA) hosted the event until 2017. In 2018, the Women's Golf Association of Massachusetts (WGAM) merged into the MGA to form Mass Golf.

The event has been won by many well-known figures in golf history, both amateurs and professionals alike. Noteworthy names include Gene Sarazen, Byron Nelson, Horton Smith, Julius Boros, Paul Harney, Dana Quigley, Geoffrey Sisk, Rob Oppenheim and Evan Harmeling. Francis Ouimet, Jesse Guilford, Don Hoenig, Kevin Johnson, and Kevin Quinn all won as amateurs. In 1919, Jesse Guilford became the first amateur to win the title, and the 1921 U.S. Amateur champion won it again in 1929. Francis Ouimet, winner of the 1913 U.S. Open, took home his lone Mass Open title in 1932.

During the early years of the event, it was considered a touring event by professionals across the country. Though Labritz won the title at age 50 last year, young golf professionals have dominated the event, with the five champions from 2015-2019 being golfers in their 20s.

The youngest winner of the Mass Open is Kevin Johnson, who won the 1986 championship at the age of 19. Jim Browning who won the 1965 Mass Open at age 50, is the oldest winner. Browning also won it in 1953.
