Course Setup

Dedham Country & Polo Club will be set up at approximately 5,940 yards and will play to a par of 70. The yardage for each round of the championship will vary due to course setup and conditions.

Architect

Dedham Country & Polo Club is the only golf course in Massachusetts designed by golden era architect Seth Raynor. Although he wasn't the original architect, Raynor's designed debuted in 1924 and introduced template holes, such as Redan (#3), Cape (#4), Maiden (#8), Biarritz (#14), and Reverse Redan (#17).

Who Can Enter

Any female amateur golfer who has an active Mass Golf Membership and a Handicap Index® not exceeding 10.0 (at the time of registration). The player must have played and posted five rounds at any Mass Golf member club/course within 12 months of the entry close date.

Schedule of Play

August 14 & 15: Stroke Play (18 holes/day)

- The low 32 players will advance to match play, beginning August 16.
- Any ties for the final Match Play qualifying place(s) will be determined by a hole-by-hole playoff, if needed, on August 16.

August 16: Round of 32 (a.m.) and Round of 16 (p.m.) August 17: Quarterfinals (a.m.) and Semifinals (p.m.)

August 18: Final Match (18 holes)

What the Winner Receives

The Amateur Champion is awarded the Championship Bowl. The Amateur Finalist receives the Curtis Memorial Trophy. The stroke play medalist(s) are awarded. The low net qualifier for match play receives the Osgood Memorial Cup. Merchandise certificates will be awarded and are redeemable at the host site.

2022 Champion

Morgan Smith (Vesper Country Club) won the 2022 Mass Women's Amateur at Orchards Golf Club in South Hadley. Smith, a first year at Georgetown University, won the 18th hole to complete a rally against University of Virginia's Rebecca Skoler (Pine Brook Country Club), 1-up, in the final match. Smith also won stroke play medalist by five shots. Both women will compete in the field again this year.

Championship History

The Massachusetts Women's Amateur Championship is the oldest championship conducted by Mass Golf. The first Massachusetts Women's Amateur was played in 1900 at Oakley Country Club, with **Grace Keyes**, a pioneer for women's amateur golf in the Bay State, winning the title. The championship has been contested every year except for 1918 and 1943-45 due to World War I and World War II, respectively.

Notable past champions include Margaret Curtis (1901, 1907, 1908, 1914), Harriot Curtis (1920), Anne Marie Tobin (1988, 1991-1995, 2000), Joanne Goodwin (1954, 1956 1958, 1961), and Tara Joy Connelly (2003, 2013), all of whom have been inducted into the Massachusetts Golf Hall of Fame.

The 2023 Women's Amateur marks the fourth time Dedham C&PC has hosted the championship. **Patricia O'Brien** (1969), **Muffy Marlio** (1982), and **Laura Torrisi** (2001) all won the title at Dedham.
