Course Setup

GreatHorse will be set up at approximately 7,228 yards and will play to a par of 72. The yardage for each round of the championship will vary due to course setup and conditions.

Architect

GreatHorse, whose current design is credited to New England-based architect Brian Silva, provides a par-72, 7,600-yard layout from the championship tees with a staggering 207 bunkers and over 200 feet of elevation change. The course has been previously selected as the 2019 New England Golf Course Owner's Association Course of the Year and listed as one of GolfWeek's Top 200 Modern Courses.

Who Can Enter

Entries are open to amateur golfers who have an active Mass Golf/GHIN Handicap Index at any public, private, semi-private, municipal or non-real estate Mass Golf member course/club not exceeding 3.6 (at the time of registration).

Schedule of Play

July 7 & 8: Stroke Play (18 holes/day)

- The low 32 players will advance to match play, beginning July 9.
- Any ties for the final Match Play qualifying place(s) will be determined by a hole-by-hole playoff, if needed, at the conclusion of Round 2.

July 9: Round of 32 (a.m.) and Round of 16 (p.m.)

July 10: Quarterfinals (a.m.) and Semifinals (p.m.)

July 11: Final Match (36 holes)

Qualifying

Qualifying, played over 18 holes, was conducted at 11 sites in Massachusetts between June 2 and June 25. In total, 96 players automatically advanced to the championship through qualifying, with alternates added at a late date.

2024 Champion

One year after making it to the final match, Framingham Country Club member Matthew Naumec won the title at him home course. The Wilbraham native, who is also a member of GreatHorse, was the 32nd and final player to make it into match play, prevailing in a playoff. In match play, he won all his matches without reaching the 17th hole, and in the final match against Worcester Country Club member **Ricky Stimets**, he rallied from 3 down after 18 and made a birdie on the 36th and final hole.

Championship History

This is the 117th Massachusetts Amateur Championship. The Mass Amateur was first played in 1903 at Myopia Hunt Club, where Arthur G. Lockwood emerged victorious. The Championship has been conducted every year since except for two years (1917-1918) during World War I and for four years (1942-1945) during World War II. The youngest winner is **Ryan Downes** who won the title at age 17 at Essex County Club in 2023. The oldest winner is **Ed Fletcher**, who was 53 when he won his lone title at Concord Country Club in 1995.

Noted past winners include Francis Ouimet, Frederick J. Wright, Jr., Ted Bishop, Kevin Johnson, James Driscoll, Frank Vana, Jr., Rob Oppenheim, and Michael Thorbjornsen. Jesse Guilford, who was inducted into the Mass Golf Hall of Fame in October 2021, is the only amateur who has won both the Mass Amateur (1916, 1921, 1924) and the Mass Open (1919, 1929). Guilford won the U.S. Amateur in 1921. Francis Ouimet also won the Mass Amateur (1913, 1914, 1915, 1919, 1922, 1925) and the U.S. Amateur (1914, 1931), as did Ted Bishop (Mass Amateur, 1940, 1946, 1961); U.S. Amateur (1946).

The 2025 Mass Amateur marks the first time GreatHorse has hosted the championship.
