### Course Setup

Winchester will be set up at approximately 6,886 and will play to a par of 71. The yardage for each round of the championship will vary due to course setup and conditions.

### Architect

Winchester traces its architectural roots to Alexander Findlay, who designed the original nine-hole course that opened Memorial Day weekend in 1903. Donald Ross first began working with the club in 1909, initially adding bunkers before expanding the layout after additional land was acquired in 1911. By 1916, Ross had fashioned an 18-hole course, and his relationship with Winchester continued for roughly a quarter-century, with Ross and his associates overseeing about two dozen more refinements through the 1930s. While the routing and underlying character largely remained intact, the course has continued to evolve with improvements from Geoffrey Cornish, Steljem Kay, and Ron Forse. Beginning in August, architect Andrew Green will begin Phase I of course restoration at Winchester.

### Who Can Enter

Entries are open to amateur golfers who have an active Mass Golf/GHIN Handicap Index at any public, private, semi-private, municipal or non-real estate Mass Golf member course/club not exceeding 3.6 (at the time of registration).

### Schedule of Play

July 6 & 7: Stroke Play (18 holes/day)

- The low 32 players will advance to match play, beginning July 8.

- Any ties for the final Match Play qualifying place(s) will be determined by a hole-by-hole playoff, if needed, at the conclusion of Round 2.

**July 8:** Round of 32 (a.m.) and Round of 16 (p.m.)

**July 9:** Quarterfinals (a.m.) and Semifinals (p.m.)

**July 10:** Final Match (36 holes)

## Qualifying

Qualifying, played over 18 holes, was conducted at 11 sites in Massachusetts between May 26 and June 18. In total, 96 players automatically advanced to the championship through qualifying, with alternates added at a late date.

## 2025 Champion

Longmeadow native **Ryan Downes**, a GreatHorse member and Vanderbilt standout became the youngest player to win two Mass Amateur titles before age 20. Downes, also the 2023 winner, opened with a 77 at GreatHorse but played his way into match play with a bogey-free 70 in Round 2, then caught from there. He won each of his first three matches before reaching the 18th hole, then rallied from 3 down against **Joey Lenane** (George Wright Golf Course) to win a 19-hole semifinal thriller. In the 36-hole final against **Patrick Kilcoyne** (Woodland GC), Downes built a 5-up lead through the morning 18, highlighted by an eagle that put him 6 up through 14 holes. He stretched the lead to 7 up on the 22nd hole and closed out the championship with a conceded par on the par-3 12th, winning 7&6. Downes will not be back this year to defend his title.

## Championship History

This is the 118th Massachusetts Amateur Championship. The Mass Amateur was first played in 1903 at Myopia Hunt Club, where **Arthur G. Lockwood** emerged victorious. The Championship has been conducted every year since except for two years (1917-1918) during World War I and for four years (1942-1945) during World War II. The youngest winner is **Ryan Downes** who won the title at age 17 at Essex County Club in 2023 and again in 2025. The oldest winner is **Ed Fletcher**, who was 53 when he won his lone title at Concord Country Club in 1995.

Noted past winners include **Francis Ouimet**, **Frederick J. Wright, Jr.**, **Ted Bishop**, **Kevin Johnson**, **James Driscoll**, **Frank Vana, Jr.**, **Rob Oppenheim**, and **Michael Thorbjornsen**. **Jesse Guilford**, who was inducted into the Mass Golf Hall of Fame in October 2021, was the first to win both the Mass Amateur (1916, 1921, 1924) and the U.S. Amateur (1921) in the same year. Francis Ouimet also won the Mass Amateur (1913, 1914, 1915, 1919, 1922, 1925) and the U.S. Amateur (1914, 1931), as did Ted Bishop (Mass Amateur, 1940, 1946, 1961); U.S. Amateur (1946).
