The course will be set up around 6,114 yards and will play to a par of 36-36 — 72. Yardages are approximate and are subject to change.

Architect

Opened on July 4, 1921, the original 9-hole golf course was designed by renowned architect Wayne Stiles. In 1925, the club hired Donald Ross to design the new nine. Two years later, at a cost of \$65,000, the second nine was ready to play. The course's front and back nines are separated by Oak Hill Road. The front nine and high point (about 1,000 ft above sea level) is on the clubhouse side, and players cross the road to play the back nine, which dips into the valley and measures about 200 yards longer than the front.

Who Can Enter

Any female amateur golfer who has an active Mass Golf Membership and a Handicap Index® not exceeding 10.0 (at the time of registration). The player must have played and posted five rounds at any Mass Golf member club/course within 12 months of the entry close date.

Schedule Of Play

August 10 & 11: Stroke Play (18 holes/day)

-The low 32 players will advance to match play, beginning August 12.

-Any ties for the final Match Play qualifying place(s) will be determined by a hole-by-hole playoff, if needed, on August 11.

August 12: Round of 32 (a.m.) and Round of 16 (p.m.)

August 13: Quarterfinals (a.m.) and Semifinals (p.m.)

August 14: Final Match (18 holes)

What The Winner Receives	The Amateur Champion is awarded the Championship Bowl. The winner is also exempt into the 2027 U.S. Women's Amateur Championship (if eligible). The Amateur Finalist receives the Curtis Memorial Trophy. The stroke play medalist(s) is also given an award. The low net qualifier for match play receives the Osgood Memorial Cup.
2025 Champion	Xavier University standout Isabel Brozena (North Andover, MA) captured her first Massachusetts Women's Amateur title at Concord Country Club with a dramatic eagle on the 16th hole to take a 1-up lead against Shannon Johnson (North Easton, MA). She held steady through two tense closing holes, including a fairway bunker shot to the middle of the green on 18.
Championship History	The Massachusetts Women's Amateur Championship is the oldest championship conducted by Mass Golf. The first Massachusetts Women's Amateur was played in 1900 at Oakley Country Club, with Concord member Grace Keyes, a pioneer for women's amateur golf in the Bay State, winning the title. The championship has been contested every year except for 1918 and 1943-45 due to World War I and World War II, respectively. Notable past champions include Margaret Curtis (1901, 1907, 1908, 1914), Harriot Curtis (1920), Anne Marie Tobin (1988, 1991-1995, 2000), Joanne Goodwin (1954, 1956 1958, 1961), and Tara Joy-Connelly (2003, 2013), all of whom have been inducted into the Massachusetts Golf Hall of Fame. Tobin won the first Mass Women's Amateur that was played at Oak Hill in 1994, defeating fellow Hall of Famer Marion Maney, 3&2 and becoming the first person to win four consecutive titles in the event. In 1999, Laura Torrisi outlasted Oak Hill's Joanne Catlin in a record-setting 25-hole championship match, with a conceded par on the 7th playoff hole.
